Crysdale refers to this as travail and in a particularly poignant passage

she says, "It is only through "being grasped by ultimate concern,' through an 'other worldly falling in love,' that one can even consider negotiating the pitfalls of travail," and "One embraces travail because one is in the embrace of God (Crysdale, 27).

As you sit reading this can you recognize that you are in the embrace of God?

The Rhythm of Life was given to me by one of the teenagers with whom I minister. Kelly speaks about a "time out" that he took, using the analogy that our life is like a tree and I quote,

"A tree with strong roots grows strong. A tree with strong roots bears much fruit. A tree with strong roots bears good fruit. A tree with strong roots can weather any storm. If a tree is uprooted and replanted often, it will not be able to sink its roots deep into the earth and therefore will not grow strong or be fruitful. The tree helped me to see that my physical, emotional, intellectual, and spiritual roots were neither strong nor deep (Kelly, 146)."

One of the gifts of the Cursillo Method is that it gives us opportunities to trust the Lord and not worry about tomorrow, to feel the embrace of a God who adores us and to sink deep roots and to nurture our relationship with the Lord. Perhaps now is a good time to examine your "roots," consider your worries and fall into the embrace of our loving, forgiving God.

## Survey Says.....

Dear Cursillista's,

We would like to take this opportunity to thank each and every one of you who graciously responded to our survey that was conducted many months ago. Your patience to date is to be commended. The response we received was OVERWHELMING! An interesting fact: For those persons who were sent this survey, three out of four persons responded back to us. That is absolutely astonishing! **THANK YOU!!!**

Before we proceed, please know that "WE"(the School of Leaders' Survey Sub-Committee Members) took this challenge to heart: we prayed, read and re-read your responses and found ourselves amazed and (yes, even sometimes confused) about the various comments we were reading. We made every attempt to assess our situation with eyes of faith.

At this time, we would like to take this opportunity to provide you with the results of this survey and to provide information for YOU to process. Keep in mind that the results of this survey can be used as an excellent tool for education. Following are overall questions, thoughts and comments. Please read each one carefully:

### WHY WAS THE SURVEY SENT?

The survey was sent in an attempt to find out what has happened to the general population of the Cursillo Movement here in the Albany Diocese. It was also formatted in such a way as to be informative and to provide a forum for the recipient to share their satisfaction and/or dissatisfaction about the movement at this time. We provided a series of opportunities for people to make comments about what was most lacking in the movement. Written responses were received -- both positive and negative -- about certain topic areas of Cursillo.

It was hoped we could IDENTIFY weak areas and provide some insight into what it may take to revive Cursillistas to come back to Grouping and Ultreyas, as well as to sponsor excellent candidates for the upcoming weekends. What we learned was most helpful.

### HOW WILL YOU RECEIVE INFORMATION?

The results of the survey are being made available to the Ultreyas and through the *Little Light* publication. If you do not attend Ultreya, you WILL miss some of the factual information until it becomes available in the printing of the *Little Light*. We have a limited amount of space in each newsletter, so the publishers will print only portions as they feel room allows.

### INTERESTING FACTS

Cursillistas responding to our survey overall were between the ages of 50 and 65 with the "average" age being 60. Most made their weekends from 1970 to the early 90's, when Cursillo in the Albany Diocese was quite active -- week-end sponsorships were not usually a problem as they are today. The men's and women's weekends were formatted the same as they are today. Over the years there has been some pre-conceived idea that the structure has become more rigid and has taken away some of the 'spirit' of the weekend. We all know that the structure of the talks has not really changed. What we "used to have" was more heart-wrenching, inner-sharing circumstances that somehow helped to deliver the message of the talk right to the heart. A few feel the talks are now too rigid and what is really missing is that we still have Team Members who do not know how to take the outline and make it their own.

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Some people simply ‘trusted’ their sponsor and agreed to go on the weekend with little or NO information. The survey actually revealed that 18% felt that they were ill informed about the weekend beforehand as well as afterward. Several people responded that if they had transportation, they would have left the weekend. (Back then, the sponsors literally always provided the transportation of the candidate to the site and were there throughout the weekend: helping in the kitchen, listening to the singing through the old corridors, spending countless hours in the Palanca Chapel and doing almost anything to help out.) We agree that it is sad that those former days of being able to help with the dishes, cooking and all those other ‘behind the scenes’ tasks have changed. **PLEASE NOTE: New York State regulations and regulations from the sponsoring facility are issues we encounter within our current time period.** We have to accept it and move forward. Many are reluctant to do so and, therefore, are pulling their support of the movement in various ways.

### **FORMER CURSILLISTAS**

So what has happened to the Cursillista? This survey shows that a minimum of 52 ministries is being served by Cursillistas. We have no doubt that even more exists! Many are actively involved in their parish not only by serving in those ministries but are active by participating in a great number of Prayer Study or group prayer activities. Sadly, it is true that by their own reporting, about 20% of the people do nothing to foster spiritual growth and are NOT particularly active in their Church.

### **“FEELINGS” REGARDING CURSILLO**

When responding to the question regarding their “*feelings about Cursillo*,” we discovered that emotions varied, depending on what was on their mind at the time. If they happened to be upset by not being asked to be on team, they responded that way. There is a LONG list of statements that are in the categories of “Frustration,” “Sadness,” “Uncomfortable,” and “ANGER.” All is not lost though because there are a FEW in the category of “HAPPY” as well.

### **SCHOOL OF LEADERS**

Very few people actually know the actual reason and mission for the **School Of Leaders** who worked so hard on this survey. If you have access to a computer, please go to the Albany Cursillo website at: [www.cursillo.org/albany](http://www.cursillo.org/albany) and look up the names of your current leadership in the School as well as those members in the current Secretariat. The School Of Leaders does exist and MANY of you are capable of having a voice in the activities of the School in The Albany Diocese.

Although our school has been in existence for many years, we are still *revitalizing* ourselves to be more in conformance with the National Movement. In the book “**The Fundamental Ideas of The Cursillo Movement**,” there are 11 pages dedicated to the function, structure, strategy, and requirements for membership. We would encourage you to read this excellent book. To summarize: “*The School is an instrument of apostolic outreach to people who have lived the experience of a Cursillo Weekend. It helps them discover, accept and grow in their vocation, bringing them closer together so they may take on the responsibility of being leaders in the Church, the Movement, and in their respective secular environments.*” If you re-read that, isn’t that something that the “*Cursillo Experience*” helps us to do after we’ve identified our talents and gifts as given to us by God? Think about that!

I pray this finds that you are enjoying your summer and renewing your Spiritual life. During one of my daily prayer times, I came across this meditation from the *Living Faith* by Karla Manternach based on Matthew 14:25 where Jesus came toward the disciples walking on the sea. I quote her:

“Jesus was full of surprises. Over and over again in the gospels, we read how the disciples were stunned by his words and actions. He healed the afflicted, associated with the ostracized and preached what seemed impossible. Yet for all their astonishing experiences of him, not one of the disciples was prepared to see Jesus walking across the water. It was something they couldn’t fathom and they reacted with fear and disbelief. I don’t think we are any more prepared than any of the God’s activity in difficult for us to less comprehend us. I more often we  
 for God’s surprises the world can be believe in, much hend. Yet it is all wonder how much would see the amazing work of God if we just expected it. How often each day we would marvel at the sheer improbability of life or love—or our very existence! Lord, you work miracles all around me. 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***THE MENS WEEKEND***

On Monday September 11, 2006 the Secretariat and the School of Leaders held a joint meeting. The sole topic of this meeting was the men's weekend. After 2 and half hours of intense discussion, deliberation, prayer and soul searching it was jointly decided to postpone the weekend. What we as a group kept coming back to was the quality of the experience for the men attending the weekend.

We are exploring some solutions to the current difficulty in obtaining candidates to have an men's weekend.
