For you and me, as we do *palanca* for the upcoming *Cursillo*, we are once again totally astounded by how much we have come to learn about the love of God since our three-day encounter. A spiritual writer once claimed that God is a verb, not a noun, because inherent in the very essence of God is action; thus love, too, is a verb; thus *palanca* is action, as we do all that we can to remind our soon-to-be *cursillistas* that life lived in God's love is a wild ride, but one that never tires us out.

Reaching Jesus – Five Steps to a Fuller Life

This is the title of book by Father David Knight who has been a long time supporter of the Cursillo movement. It's also the book that we're discussing at our monthly School of Leaders meetings.

The first step is to choose to be **Christian**, to make Jesus Christ as Savior an active participant in everything we do. The second step is to choose to be a **Disciple**, to lead a life characterized by reflection on the message of Jesus. The third step is to choose to be a **Prophet**, to make everything in our lives and lifestyle bear witness to Christ. The fourth step is to choose to be a **Priest**, to mediate the life of God to others. And, the fifth step is to choose to be a **King**, to take responsibility for establishing the Kingdom of God.

The last three steps refer to our baptism when we were marked with oil as a sign that we are consecrated to God and anointed by the Holy Spirit. Our anointing was also a sign that we are joined to Christ and share in his threefold mission as prophet, priest, and king.

Even if you're not able to join us at the School of Leaders, I'd highly recommend the book. It's available in Catholic book stores or from Father David Knight's website at <u>www.HisWay.com</u>

With the season of Lent upon us, maybe one of those "extra" things you want to add to your personal list this year is to attend the School of Leaders. There are two opportunities per month.
