"How to Get to Heaven from Ireland..." Spiritual Director's Comments

A Sunday school teacher was testing her class to see if they understood the concept of getting to heaven. She asked them, "If I sold my house and my car, had a jumbo yard sale, and gave all my money to the Church, would that get me into heaven?" "No!" the children answered. If I cleaned the church every day, mowed the lawn and tended the garden, and kept everything tidy, would that get me into heaven?" Again, the answer was, "No!" "Well, then, if I were kind to animals and gave sweeties to all the children and loved my husband, would that get me into heaven?" Once more, they all answered, "No!" She was beaming with pride as she continued, "Then how can I get into heaven?" A six year-old boy then shouted out, "You got to be jumpin' dead!"

In a way, *Cursillo* is about getting into heaven. By deepening our faith in Jesus Christ, committing ourselves to journey together in the Church, and becoming persons with generous hearts and forgiving spirits, we say yes to the invitation of our God to live forever in the Kingdom. As *Cursillistas*, we will soon be doing *Palanca* for another group of chosen women to ensure their awareness that they are never alone, but are part of a large community of disciples. We pray and fast in order to encourage them to open their hearts a little wider to the joy that comes from acknowledging God's love for them.

For some, this deepening awareness of God's love is truly overwhelming; for others it is a mere whisper. People come from different places on their faith journeys and thus, their experience of the Spirit may be more or less intense. God knows, of course, the perfect time and place for these particular women to begin their life in Cursillo and gifts them with just the right amount of grace to touch their hearts. While we may observe, from the outside, seemingly varied degrees of enthusiasm and while we may try to quantify how much each one is has gotten out of the experience, God touches each soul with the precise strength or gentleness that each one needs. May our Palanca only assist Him in touching their hearts and may our faith in God's love for each of us be deepened in the process!
