"What Should I Do Now?" Spiritual Director's Comments

There was a Scottish painter named Smokey MacGregor who was very interested in making a penny where he could, so he thinned down his paint to make it go a wee bit further. As it happened, he got away with this for some time, but eventually the Baptist Church decided to do a big restoration job on the outside of one of their biggest buildings. Smokey put in a bid and, because his price was low, he got the job. So, he set about erecting the scaffolding and setting up the planks and buying the paint and, yes, thinning it down with turpentine.

Well, Smokey was up on the scaffolding painting away, the job nearly completed, when suddenly there was a horrendous clap of thunder, the sky opened, and the rain poured down washing the thinned paint from all over the church and knocking Smokey clear off the scaffold only to land on the lawn among the gravestones, surrounded by telltale puddles of thinned and useless paint. Smokey was no fool. He knew this was a judgment from the Almighty, so he got down on his knees and cried, "Oh God, forgive me. What should I do now?" And from the thunder, a mighty voice spoke, "Repaint! Repaint! And thin no more!"

Smokey knew it was a judgment from the Almighty. For so many of us, Cursillo was a moment of judgment, not in the sense of confronting our sins (although reconciliation often plays a huge role in the weekend experience), but in the even larger sense of a judgment on our lives up to that point and where we want to go from there. Our Fourth Day is the result of how that judgment has affected our lives and, as we prepare to welcome more Cursillistas into the Cursillo community, we spend time in prayer and sacrifice (Palanca), since that is one way in which our Cursillo living differs from our pre-Cursillo living.

We make judgments all the time and, as we have come to appreciate, so does our God. The only difference is God's judgments are always imbued with mercy and love, while ours are often filled with envy and arrogance. Often I judge others based on how they differ from me, or irritate me, or threaten me. God judges us based on how his infinite love can

mold us and shape us, not unlike Jeremiah's vision of God working at the potter's wheel (Jer. 18). Whenever there is even the slightest flaw, God reworks us into the image and likeness of God in which we have been created. Yes, God's judgments are not to be feared; they are to be embraced, for they always result in our growth in holiness and grace (unless, of course, we choose to not allow God to fashion and recreate us, but then it is ourselves we should fear and not the mercy of God).

As we prepare to celebrate another Cursillo, we pray for the team and candidates and as we recognize the moment of grace it is for all of them, we open ourselves to the moment of grace it is for all of us as well. Let us be open to the judgment of the Almighty; let us rejoice in his overwhelming love and grace; let us repaint and thin no more as our Palanca for the upcoming Cursillo.
