"So Help Us God" Spiritual Director's Comments

(Editor's Note: Father Dave is on a well deserved vacation. With this in mind we went through some of his past pennings and found one that we thought deserved a second look. If you have a very good memory, you will remember this from July, 2004.)

I thought you might be interested in the following letter I received...

Today I went to visit the new World War II Memorial in Washington D.C. and I got an unexpected history lesson. Since I'm a baby boomer, I was one of the youngest in the crowd. Most were the age of my parents, veterans of the "greatest war" with their families. It was a beautiful day and people were smiling and happy to be there. Hundreds of us milled around the memorial, reading the inspiring words of Ike and Truman that are engraved there.

On the Pacific side of the memorial, a group of us gathered to read the words President Roosevelt used to announce the attack on Pearl Harbor: "Yesterday, December 7, 1941—a date which will live in infamy—the United States of America was suddenly and deliberately attacked." One woman read the words aloud: "With confidence in our armed forces, with the unbounding determination of our people, we will gain the inevitable triumph" But as she read, she was suddenly angry. "Wait a minute," she said, "they left out the end of the quote. They left out the most important part. Roosevelt said, so help us God.

"You're probably right," her husband said, "We're not supposed to say things like that now." "I know I'm right," she insisted. "I remember the speech." The two shook their heads sadly and walked away.

The people who edited out that part of the speech when they engraved it on the memorial could have fooled me. I was born after the war. But they couldn't fool the people who were there. Roosevelt's words are engraved on their hearts.

I share this with you as we begin a new season of *Cursillo* to say in words much more graphic than my own—*so help us God.* Help our families, our parish communities, our nation, our world. If we can no

longer publicly ask God for help, then let us fill our churches to ask for that help. May all that we hope to accomplish this year begin and end with our deepest gratitude for God's ongoing help.
