The children had all been photographed and the teacher was trying to persuade them each to buy a copy of the group picture. She commented, "Just think how nice it will be to look at it when you're all grown up and say, 'There's Jennifer, she's a doctor,' or 'That's Michael, he's a lawyer." A small voice at the back of the room rang out, "And there's the teacher. She's dead!"

When we look at our cursillo pictures, there is perhaps an honesty there that photographs all of us with some area within that had died. I have often wondered if the picture would look any more radiant if it were taken on Sunday afternoon. When each of us walked into that room with the cookies and coffee on that fateful Thursday evening, there was, to be sure, a little resurrection that needed to take place in everyone's heart and soul. And, likewise to be sure, resurrection happened!

The spring Cursillos have the liturgical advantage of taking place during the Lent/Easter season, thereby setting a backdrop for the encounter to take place. Lent being what it is, I know I, for one, often do a little more palanca for the March cursillo, since some of my usual palanca are already being covered in my Lenten fast. Thus, I have to be a little more creative (although I imagine God smiling if I concluded that I could use Lenten disciplines as palanca too and not really do anything extra. Could God call me a weasel?).

But, in the end, "dying to self" we will embrace as palanca, with the aura of Lent making them even more meaningful for us. And in the process,

undoubtedly, as we look at the picture ourselves in the mirror of our souls, each of us will see someone who is fully alive—in Christ and for others!
