Asst. Spiritual Director's Comments

When we were in the midst of the last real cold snap of winter I was walking into my 4th Day group early in the morning. A cardinal was piercing the chilly air with his song from his perch high in a nearby maple tree. It almost seemed a bit out of place to have a bird trying so hard to sing spring on a morning that winter was definitely in control of.

Aldo Leopold, the father of modern conservation put his trust in Canadian geese. He wrote in *The Sand County Almanac* that those birds that winter in Wisconsin can sing one day but then if spring seems to not cooperate that they can just resume their winter silence. But geese stake a lot of effort to fly hundreds of miles northward. They can't be wrong because they won't have the energy to fly back south if they arrive too early.

I understand his viewpoint, but perhaps he may have misunderstood the winter bird's song. The goose needs to see telltale signs of what is to risk life and feather to begin the migration. They understand what they can actually see and feel. And so when their V formations knife into the north wind you know that warmer, more westward and southerly breezes aren't far behind.

But the winter bird, like that cardinal on that frosty morning perhaps was sensing the promise of what will be. His song can reinforce the spirit of those who are growing weary of winter and hope for what seems still too far off.

Faith can be that way. When God is near and the signs are all around us, our witness, our song, can point Him out to others. But when God seems distant or far off, our witness, our song can reassure others to hold fast to the hope and the promise.

Sing out Earth and Sky! Sing of the God who loves you!
