Cursillos in Christianity of Green Bay, WI (the Cursillo Movement of the Green Bay Diocese) maintains an email prayer chain that is available for use by all Cursillistas to share prayer intentions.

Here are a few things you should know:

- 2. If you want to have these emails sent to a different email address please use the <u>update subscription preferences</u> link found at the bottom of the Prayer Chain email. Simply enter the new email address when prompted.
- 3. If you want to unsubscribe please use the unsubscribe from this list link found at the bottom of the Prayer Chain email. Please note: clicking this link is an instant removal from the list.

Here is our Policy that explains the acceptable use of the Prayer Chain:

The Prayer Chain has the following purpose:

- 1. To provide a medium for people to request the prayers of others for any reasonable intention.
- 2. To promote the Cursillo Weekends and solicit palanca for candidates and team members.
- 3. To promote any other Cursillo sanctioned activity.
 - Examples of these activities would include Ultreyas,
 Small Group Reunions, the Day of Enrichment, and School of Leaders.

The Prayer Chain is not intended to promote non-Cursillo events, even though they may be worthy Catholic or Church events. This would include any fundraiser, speaking engagement, concert, etc. We understand that there are many worthy events but it is our desire to keep the Prayer Chain as uncluttered as possible so that the prayer requests remain the primary focus and are easy to locate in the email.

To maintain this focus we ask the following:

- 1. All requests are to be submitted in a "prayer" format.
- 2. The use of last names is discouraged unless you can assure us the family has consented to the use of the full name. Without this consent the last names will be deleted.
- 3. Do not submit anything other than prayer request or Cursillo business or activities.
 - a. If you wish to request an exception you must submit a written request, along with the message you want posted, to the Lay Director of the Cursillo Movement. The message will not be posted until an exception is granted by the Executive Committee or the Secretariat.

Please understand that the Prayer Chain is posted by volunteers. Our goal is to post prayer requests Monday thru Friday but circumstances may delay the posts.
