Swans & Awareness of Christ Assistant Spiritual Director Comments

I can remember when I was younger that it was special to hear that first far-off note that caught my ear. I would then listen more intently and fixated on the sound as it continued to build into a chorus. With eyes drawn upward now they suddenly materialized – the first flock of spring geese! It always warmed my spirits to know that here were birds that literally staked their lives on the promise that spring was here.

Now, with growing populations and winters where there is still some open water to be had, at least some geese now stay all winter. I live just west of Green Bay and as soon as we had those first warmer days – when you knew that there was still a lot of winter left - the geese from the Bay already could be heard and seen as they came to the neighboring farms fields in search of some waste grain. It has become too easy to hear and see geese that they no longer capture my attention.

But now I have discovered tundra swans. I remember reading about them years ago but it has been only the last 15 years or so that I began to see them. Last year the town converted the farm field adjacent to my property into a wetland area. This spring we heard swans coming in one morning while it was still dark. As soon as it got light enough to see my wife and I went over to where we could see the pond that was freshly free of ice, and there they were – about 500 tundra swans.

Here again is something to catch the eye and ear and the heart. The geese will be here all year but the swans only stay for a week or so as they rest and wait patiently for spring to spread northward.

Life is always wonderful and special. But sometimes if we let it, it can become routine and "usual". I love the fact that I know my fourth day group is going to challenge me each week to recall when I was most aware of Christ's presence. He is always there even in the day-to-day routine of life. Prayer Chain Update and Information

This article is going to give a quick update on the Cursillo Prayer Chain and ask for your help on a few housekeeping items.

First, we have exceeded 850 recipients on the daily emails. Our typical open rate for any given "prayer request" email is just over 40%, meaning that a very large group of Cursillistas join together every day in prayer for these intentions. This is not only awesome, but it pleases God when we come together to pray and ask for His grace.

Now, on to those housekeeping issues. Overall, the volume of prayer requests has been increasing, a trend for which we are very thankful. As we grow, we have needed to adapt and make changes. A little over a year ago, we had to change to a professional email service that complies with all federal anti-Spam laws. This change has brought certain needed efficiencies, but unfortunately sometimes the rules imposed by the laws make us seem inflexible.

The biggest issue we hear about is that subscribers get removed by the system halting future emails. If the system removes your address (which can happen for a variety of reasons, including your having clicked the "**unsubscribe from this list**" link on the bottom of the email) we cannot add you back in, the system will not allow us to put the same address back in. We are allowed to add an email address once, which is done upon an initial request or automatically for the Babe Chicks upon completion of the Cursillo Weekend. To be added back after that is not difficult but needs to be done by the recipient. Go to any past Prayer Chain email and click on the "<u>View this email in your browser</u>" link (upper right corner), and this will open a web page. In the upper left of the web page, there is a "Subscribe" button on the top left. Click this button and enter your email address, first and last name, Cursillo # if you know it and click "Subscribe to list". This will generate an email to you where you must confirm that you want to be added. Without completing this final step, you are not added. By using this same process, you can also add anyone else you know of who wants to be added.

If you have a new email address or a different change to make, please click on the "**update subscription preferences**" link on the bottom of the email. This will display your current information and allow you to make those changes. It is a tremendous help to us if you make those changes yourself.

A few last items to please consider:

- Please proof the prayer requests you are submitting. Occasionally, there are missing words or unclear requests that make it difficult for us to understand. Many of our prayer requests are being sent by smart phones today, but we ask that you still use proper punctuation and take a few seconds to proof read the email first. We do reformat some of the prayer requests to make them clear, grammatically correct and somewhat consistent.
- Please keep the prayer request brief. God knows our complete story, and we can be concise in our prayer request. Also, please do not send attachments or family letters in place of a prayer request.
- Please do not forward other prayer chains. If there is a prayer request that you want to share, please retype it and submit it on its own.
- Please don't repeat the same request multiple times. God hears our request and knows our need. For example, if
 a surgery is a week away please do not submit the same request everyday leading up to the surgery. It is
 appropriate to submit a prayer request, and certainly if something changes we welcome your new prayer request.
- Please refrain from sending in anything political or from promoting any causes. Also, please do not send in any non-Cursillo announcements. There are many worthy messages and announcements that people want to share, but we limit our focus to sharing prayer requests and promoting Cursillo activities.
- Sending emails to work emails is not a problem for us, but out-of-office reply messages do clutter our inbox. If you frequently use auto reply messages, please consider using another email address to receive the prayer requests.

Thank you for your help and understanding. Our goal is to keep our prayer chain growing in service to the Cursillistas of the diocese. If you have thoughts, questions or concerns you wish to share, concerning the prayer chain or any Cursillo related matter, please feel free to reply to any prayer chain email, and we will forward your email to the appropriate person.
