At a recent Pinewood Derby with the Cub Scouts, a third grader came up to me at the lunch and said, "I sure feel sorry for whoever made the egg salad sandwiches." I said, "Why is that? Because it took so much work?" He said, "Oh no, it's because my Mom's are so much better." We spend our lives living in comparison-mode. In elementary school it's who's the teacher's favorite? In middle/high school, it's who's the most popular? Or the best-looking? Or the most athletic? In early adulthood, it's who's got the best-paying job? In late adulthood, it's who has the most grandchildren? In our advanced years, it's who's got the best health? And on Cursillo, it's who's the holiest?
