Lay Director Message

Recently, while driving to an early morning exercise class, I was surrounded by a dense fog which had formed due to the weather conditions that day. The dark sky and the thick fog made navigating the very familiar roads unusually difficult. As I approached the first intersection, I rolled down my windows and listened for cars to approach, while at the same time watched and waited for headlights that would signal oncoming traffic. Because the landmarks and street signs were difficult to see, I missed a turn on the way. What was normally a quick and easy drive turned out to be a challenging way to start the day. Thankfully, I arrived safely at my destination, and didn't have to deal with the fog on the drive home.

This experience reminded me that sometimes we enter into a sort of spiritual fog when conditions in our life change. We may get busy with work and social commitments, have health or financial issues to deal with, or maybe tensions in the family rise. Any number of things can easily steer us off our path. During these times when the fog settles in around us, we may lose track of the landmarks and guideposts that we usually rely upon, and we may momentarily lose our way. In reality, these are the times that we should turn to the sturdy tripod of Piety, Study and Action that we learned about on

our Cursillo weekend, knowing that they are always out there, even if momentarily hidden by the fog. Perhaps meditating on a Scripture passage or spending some time in the adoration chapel would allow us to be still and hear what God is trying to say to us during a challenging time. Tuning into Relevant Radio or listening to a Catholic Lighthouse Media presentation might just give us the answer to a question that is weighing on the heart. Reaching out to a friend in need or paying it forward could be what we need to refocus and realign our priorities. The grace that we receive when we live out our faith is truly a gift from God. It is a gift that He continues to offer, and it is one that helps us navigate the road that leads out of the fog and into true happiness.


