# **Spiritual Director Reflection**

Why do we send an invitation to people we want to be at a party?

### 1. To Build and maintain relationships

Everyone wants to be invited, wants to be known and want to be an important person. So, it's important to get invited to the most important events from someone you know and create harmony. Not only motivate a person to get to know you more or want to work with you, but also it can strengthen the relationships between you and the group that you invited. It's a simple way to help you maintain your friendship and people that you would like to get to know them.

#### 2. Create connections

Invitation card will help you maintain friendships and build a stronger connection between you and people who you would like to know. Since Invitation card will show that you care about that person and see them as the important people.

#### Mission Possible

In recent days, the phrase "Mission Statement" has been popping up in a number of places, which got me thinking: As Cursillistas, what is our mission? A good place to start is to understand the purpose of Cursillo, itself. Eduardo Bonnin (the founder of Cursillos in Christianity) said:

The Cursillo does not aim at getting the best people to become Christians, nor that Christians become better, but that Christians be Christian. That they understand that being a conscious Christian means being converted at all times. All this so that they gradually get to discover, from the very place where God has planted them, that God loves them in Christ. (Study of the Charism, pg. 148)

We begin this discovery on our Cursillo weekend. Hopefully, our mission, then, is to continue that discovery as we return to our environments, live our life in Grace, and bring others close to Christ. As missionaries, we need a solid support system to keep us going, both in our successes, and in our difficulties. That support system consists of consistent contact with Christ and consistent contact with our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Our contact with Christ is to be filled with Him through the Sacraments, where we will be taught to know Him better and more deeply appreciate His friendship. Regular reception of Holy Eucharist and frequenting the Sacrament of Reconciliation will give us the grace and courage needed for the journey. "Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing". (John 15:5)

Our contact with our sisters and brothers and Christ is made through attending group reunions and Ultreyas. When we gather with other Christians sharing a common goal, we are able to encourage each other in our mission, and keep the spirit and friendship of Cursillo going. Our small groups provide a regular means to share our life of piety, study and action with a group of trusted friends. Likewise, the Ultreya brings the wider Cursillo community together in an effort to keep the small groups from feeling isolated and to stay true to the mission of evangelizing their environments. St. Paul gives us good advice: "We must consider how to rouse one another to love and good works. We should not stay away from our assembly, as is the custom of some, but encourage one another . . ." (Heb. 10: 24-25)

So, my fellow Cursillistas, I encourage you to boldly live your mission as a Christian and take advantage of small group reunions and Ultreyas offered through Cursillo. # From Oshkosh Area

Take Hwy 41 S to Fond du Lac. Take Hwy 151 N to Hwy HH. Turn R East on HH and follow to Plymouth Trail Road. Turn L North on Plymouth Trail and Follow to Hickory Lane. Turn R East on Hickory to Madison Street. Turn L North on Madison Street. Holy Rosary will be on your right.
