Spiritual Director Reflection

One of the things we promote through the Cursillo movement is to pray for people to attend the weekends and to pray for those who have said yes. Here are some suggestions about how we can effectively pray for these people.

Ask Jesus to tell you what to pray for them. He is good at giving us insight into how to pray for people. You may expect something else. Have the courage to pray whatever God puts on your heart.

- 1. Let the Lord know that you're available to be the answer to the prayer(s) you're praying for people. Is there something God wants you to say or do? Yes? Then say or do it.
- 2. Let the people know you're praying for them and ask if there's anything they would like you to pray for. When you feel it's appropriate, ask if anything has happened in their life related to their prayer requests.
- 3. Find a Scripture that fits where your friends are on their spiritual journey. Then pray the verses back to God. For example, "Jesus, you said: 'Seek and you will find.' I ask that you put it in my friend's heart to seek you so they can find you."
- 4. Pray that God brings other people into the lives of your friends who will show and share with them the love of God. God loves using many faces and voices to reveal his goodness to someone. You are part of a family a team living this out together.
- 5. Take time to thank God for the people you're focused on. Think back on any way you've seen God work in the lives of your friends. Let your friends know that you've been thanking God for what you see Him doing in their lives.
- 6. Set a reminder on your phone or smartwatch to pray. If you're like me, this positive disruption will prompt you to do what you want.

Exercising the power of love: Apostolic Action

What did you take home from your Cursillo weekend? Personally, I took the Cursillo tripod. Well, not the Cursillo tripod that is assembled during the Rollos, but something more important; I took the method of incorporating Piety, Study and Action into my daily life. I am reminded of those three important aspects of living a Christian life every time I join my weekly group reunion or attend a monthly Ultreya.

It has been said that Action is the perfection of piety, dedicating our very lives to God by aligning our will to His will, and then doing what we have been asked to do. Action is responding to the command of Jesus written in John 13:34-35. "I give you a new commandment – to love one another. Just as I have loved you, you are to love one another. Everyone will know by this that you are my disciples – if you have love for one another." Simply stated, Action is exercising the power to love God, self, and others just as Jesus has loved us. As I reflect on how Jesus loved, I remember the stories of turning water in to wine at a wedding feast, feeding 5,000 people with five loaves and two fish, and sharing meals with tax collectors and sinners. He then exhorts us to care for each other by satisfying the physical needs of our brothers and sisters. In Matthew 25:40 Jesus told his followers "...Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me".

So many people in our world, and in our very communities, need our love and support. One way we can show our care and love is by supporting local food pantries so that anyone, anywhere, can get food to feed themselves and their families. To that end, the Secretariat has approved the idea to implement a food collection in conjunction with our Cursillo weekends. Any food collected will be donated to the parish hosting the Cursillo weekend if they have a food pantry, or if they don't have a food pantry of their own, it will go to a pantry located in the community where the Cursillo is being held.

The Men's spring Cursillo is being held at St. John the Baptist parish in Howard; therefore, the food drive will benefit both their parish food pantry and Paul's Pantry in Green Bay. If you would like to support this initiative, please bring a non-perishable food item or a cash donation on Sunday evening and drop it in the bins located at the entrance. All money and food items collected will be delivered to the food pantry after the weekend.
