SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR REFLECTION

De Colores,

I am Deacon Brian Albers and I will be doing my best to be the new Spiritual Advisor in Deacon Tom Gritton's position. These are very big shoes to fill and I'm humbled and excited to be in this role.

As a short introduction, I lived my Cursillo number 199 so it's been what, 15 years ago. I was ordained to the Diaconate in 2018, following in the footsteps of several Cursillista Deacons. I'm assigned to St Mary of the Immaculate Conception parish in Greenville where my family has been members for the last 25+ years.

In Mark 6:7-13 Jesus commissioned the twelve and sent them out two by two to spread the message of the Gospel. He gave them specific instructions about what to bring with them, to show they have trust that the Lord will provide for what they need. He also told them: "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave." Why did Jesus tell them this and what does that have to do with us?

Jesus wanted the disciples to stay at the first house that accepted them so the disciples could establish a relationship with the people in that household. This would form the basis of their preaching and spreading the gospel in that area. They would spend time with their hosts, eat meals with them, have thought provoking conversations, and opportunities to weave in the message of Jesus and salvation. You can't do that if you don't spend time with people; if you move from person to person or just standing on a street corner yelling about repentance. It takes time and shared experience to build a relationship.

In summary, Jesus wanted them to be ministers through relationships, through establishing friendships first. Does that sound familiar to you? Jesus wanted them to <u>Make</u> a friend, <u>Be</u> a friend, then <u>Bring</u> that friend to Christ. This forms the basis of the Cursillo method. Building off the relationship with our friends we can share the relationship we have with the Lord. We introduce them as friends, not as concepts or vague ideas.

I'm sure we've all been in situations where a conversation with one of your friends starts to turn to a discussion that's about Jesus. Sometimes they come out of the blue or seem really out of place. But these are the opportunities to share our friendship with Christ. This is the time we introduce our friends and give the Holy Spirit the window to have an encounter with our friend.

We are given the same mission the disciples were to spread the Gospel. Just like the twelve, the Lord wants us to go out, trusting that He is with us. Not being afraid to be a witness in our everyday lives. He wants us to bring our friends to Christ and you're the best way for those two to meet!

Your Palanca for the weekend is critical for success. Remember that Palanca, the "lever", is your prayer and sacrifices for the intention of the weekend. The Palanca letters are merely the conveyance of your Palanca of prayers and sacrifices. You are reminded that if you generate a Palanca letter from your computer, please take a moment to read the letter to check for updates and that the gender (MEN) is correct. If possible, it is very helpful if the Palanca letters are alphabetized. This saves a lot of time when sorting the letters.
Important Palanca Information! In an effort to streamline Palanca mailing, all Palanca for Cursillos will be sent to the Cursillo post office box and will then be brought to the Cursillo location to be distributed to the candidates. Please do not mail Palanca to the parish. Palanca is truly the act, not the letter, but it is nice for the candidates to actually receive the letter that someone took the time to write. (A reminder, Palanca letters for the team members are also important. It is a bit awkward if the candidates have a

stack of letters to open and the team members at their tables only have a few letters to open.)

So please send your Palanca to the Cursillo post office box, or if you like, Palanca can also be dropped off at the mailbox on the Cursillo trailer at the Cursillo location.
