Let me begin by saying how honored I am to have been appointed by Cardinal Dolan to serve as your Spiritual Advisor. As most of you know, I truly believe that laypeople are the Church. I further believe that the Cursillo movement is one of the lay movements that helps to build the Church. The mission of every Cursillista is to bring Christ to those they meet in their Fourth Day through their actions, word and deed.

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A Message from the Lay Director



When Jesus asked Peter to put his nets into the water again, after he had fished through the night without success, Peter's nets came back bursting with fish. Jesus then told Peter he would make him a fisher of people. This story is told in Luke 5:4-6 and with similarity after Jesus' resurrection in John 21:3-6.

As Christians and Cursillistas, we know that Jesus asks us to follow in the footsteps of Peter to bring his Good News into our surroundings. The fish of Cursillo include those whom Pope Francis identifies as being on the margins who have run out of hope and drink only of discouragement. Eduardo Bonnín, our Cursillo founder, identifies these same as the "faraway." The message of Cursillo in good part is directed toward serving and bringing the Good News to these "faraway," all the while building a Christian community of friendship that provides a foundation of strength and perseverance in this mission.

As your new Cursillo Lay Director beginning last July, I would like to say that I am humbled and honored to serve the Cursillo community in this position. When I began my Cursillo journey eleven years ago, I certainly could not have expected to be serving in this capacity. John DeJulio, our previous Lay Director, taught me so much in both action and deed. He inspired me with a happy leadership style, and one of doing. John was instrumental in reforming the School of Leaders under one roof at St. Augustine's Church in New City, which has become a blessing in the unity of our New York Cursillo (English). Before that, I served as Pre-Cursillo chairperson with Jim Odell as Lay Director. Jim provided my first introduction to the Secretariat and was instrumental in organizing the first Cursillo de Cursillos for our Archdiocese. The insights and understanding into the foundation and depths of the Cursillo Movement that I gained during that time serves me to the present day.

My hope and prayer during my service as Lay Director is that our Cursillo community grows in numbers and that the foundations of our Fourth Day in Group Reunion and Ultreya are strengthened. The Ultreya, and particularly Group Reunion, provide us with the spiritual food and emotional strength to sustain us on our mission. The bonds of friendship and the tripod of piety, study, and action that give us perseverance are developed and maintained

in Group Reunion and Ultreya. These friendships and the enlightenments that Jesus gives us on our journey are forged and tempered in His Holy Name so that we may carry on His work.

Some of our Ultreyas are small, and the attendance may have large swings, but I encourage you not to be discouraged by this and to persevere. I have attended small Ultreyas and have felt as spiritually nourished as with larger numbers. Christ is always present. By perseverance in prayer and petition to Jesus Christ, our numbers will grow in accordance with God's will.

Perhaps there are a number of Cursillistas who are no longer active in Cursillo because they let their journey slip for a while and might no longer feel welcome. We of course know differently that they are always welcome and encourage them to be part of our community, no matter how long away. I propose that we do our best to reach out to these. Rebuilding our numbers in this way will also help us build with new candidates. Perhaps you can remember someone you sponsored or who was on your table during the Weekend and can reach out to them and welcome them back. The Group Reunion and Ultreya are so much more than just social gatherings. They have real and sustaining value in helping us hear the words of Jesus and guiding us on our path in Christ.

As we continue our Cursillo journey and mission, we are reminded that the fish are many, but the fishers few. Happy fishing in the name of Jesus Christ!! May you bring them to Christ with the smile of Christian joy.



Updated Pilgrim's Guides! By Jim Santos

On January 4 the National Cursillo Movement debuted the new Pilgrim's Guide. Beside having a beautiful new cover, the new guide is a considerable improvement on the Guide that we have been using since 1994.

Our new Guide has revised morning and evening prayers, as well as revised prayers before and after meditation. These new versions are in an easier to absorb tone and vocabulary.

There is a new version of the Stations of the Cross, written by Fr. Christopher Llanos, S.J that rely less on scripture and more on meditation.

The Holy Mass is included, which should be a great help for those of us who are still trying to remember the Act of Contrition and Nicene Creed.

The Saturday Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary (the Sabatina) is now included.

Several items have been removed (such as Group Reunion and Ultreya format) in an effort to tailor the Guide to the individual.

Why a new Guide? In the continuing attempt to move toward a better understanding of the Charism of the Movement, it was decided to use the Pilgrim's Guide currently being used by the Cursillo Movement of Majorca, Spain. Their manual was translated to English for our use. In addition, unlike the older Guides that were different from one another, the new Guides in English, Spanish, and Vietnamese are now identical. One Movement, one Guide.

I believe that everyone that sees the new Pilgrim's Guide will not only agree that it is a great improvement, but will also want to get one for themselves! They are available through the National Cursillo website at http://www.natl-cursillo.org/cursillo-literature/

Cursillo (English) - Our History in the Archdiocese of New York

Did you ever wonder how the Rooster Crows Newsletter got its name and when it started? The name is a perfect fit of imagery. Its origin dates back to a conversation in 1972 between long-time Cursillistas George Burke and Ed Koziol at Ed's kitchen table. George and Ed met while serving on the team of a Cursillo in 1971. Pierre Poux was rector. Soon after, George was asked to organize and create a newsletter for the New York archdiocesanwide Cursillo community. Ed offered to help. As they sat at the kitchen table, George spotted the Kellogg's Cornflake box picturing the Kellogg's rooster and decided that would be a great logo. The name for the newsletter was a "lightbulb moment". (Or maybe the Holy Spirit).

WHEN I WAS ASKED IF I WOULD WRITE AN ARTICLE FOR THE ROOSTER CROWS I WAS NOT GIVEN A TOPIC BUT SINCE THIS FEBRUARY MARKS THE 50TH ANNIVERSARY OF MY ORIGINAL WEEKEND IT SEEMED TO ME THAT I SHOULD SAY "YES" AND GIVE WITNESS TO WHAT CURSILLO HAS MEANT TO ME.

MY FIRST HUSBAND, JOE GUTOWSKI, WHO DIED IN 1993, AND I BOTH MADE OUR CURSILLOS IN SPANISH HARLEM IN 1966. IT SHAPED THE REST OF OUR LIVES. VATICAN II HAD JUST ENDED AND THERE WAS A NEW ENERGY AND SPIRIT BLOWING THROUGH THE CHURCH. THE MESSAGE OF CURSILLO FIT RIGHT INTO THAT SPIRIT ESPECIALLY WITH ITS EMPHASIS ON THE ROLE OF THE LAITY AS "PRIEST, PROPHET AND KING" AND THE EMPHASIS ON GOD'S UNCONDITIONAL LOVE WAS A SPECIAL GIFT TO ME. I FELT AS THOUGH, TO BORROW THE TITLE OF A BOOK BY MARCUS BORG, I WAS "MEETING JESUS AGAIN FOR THE FIRST TIME". I HAD LOST THE JESUS I HAD KNOWN AS A CHILD AND DISCOVERED IN THOSE THREE DAYS THAT HE WAS/IS EVERYWHERE. IT WAS AN INNER HEALING. AND THE TOOLS THAT CURSILLO OFFERS FOR GROWTH, ESPECIALLY ITS EMPHASIS ON THE TRIPOD OF PIETY, STUDY AND ACTION, HAVE KEPT ME ON THE PILGRIMAGE THAT IS OUR SPIRITUAL LIFE. STUDY HAS AT TIMES STRETCHED ME BEYOND MY COMFORT LEVEL BUT IN STRETCHING I HAVE BEEN ENCOURAGED TO SEARCH FOR THE "MORE" THAT IS ALWAYS A PART OF GOD. ACTION, "CHRIST IS COUNTING ON YOU", HAS BROUGHT ME TO PLACES AND PEOPLE AND ACTIVITIES I MIGHT NEVER HAVE PURSUED WITHOUT THE CONCEPT OF THE TRIPOD AS ESSENTIAL TO FOLLOWING HIM. PRAYER IS A LITTLE HARDER TO MEASURE BUT MY CONCEPT OF PRAYER HAS BROADENED. IT HAS BECOME LESS WORDY. THE TRAPPIST MONK, THOMAS KEATING, TELLS US THAT "SILENCE IS GOD'S FIRST LANGUAGE. EVERYTHING ELSE IS A POOR TRANSLATION".

A FEW YEARS AGO ONE OF MY GRANDCHILDREN SAID, "GRANDMA, YOU HAVE THE BEST FRIENDS" .WHEN I ASKED HER WHY SHE FELT THAT WAY SHE ANSWERED, "BECAUSE YOU'RE ALWAYS THERE FOR EACH OTHER". FRIENDSHIP IS AT THE HEART OF CURSILLO, "MAKE A FRIEND, BE A FRIEND.....". MARY RYAN, WHO WITH HER LATE HUSBAND, DON, HAVE GIVEN MUCH TIME AND ENERGY TO CURSILLO, AND I SAT NEXT TO ONE ANOTHER ON WOMEN'S CURSILLO #3 IN 1966. WE HAVE BEEN FRIENDS EVER SINCE. THE LIST OF FRIENDS, ACTUALLY, IS VERY LONG AND, AS MY GRANDAUGHTER NOTICED, WE HAVE BEEN THERE FOR ONE ANOTHER. WE HAVE REJOICED TOGETHER AND WE HAVE GRIEVED TOGETHER. FRIENDSHIP IS NOT UNIQUE TO CURSILLO BUT IT IS BROUGHT TO ANOTHER LEVEL IN GROUP REUNION WHERE CHRIST ANIMATES ALL WE SAY AND DO. IT IS A UNIQUE GIFT THAT CURSILLO OFFERS AND AFTER ALL THESE YEARS I STILL GROUP .

AS WE ALL DID I HEARD MANY TALKS ON MY WEEKEND BUT ONE PHRASE HAS STAYED WITH ME, PARTICULARLY WHEN ALL ELSE SEEMED TO BRING NO RESOLUTION OR CONSOLATION. IT HAS, AT THOSE TIMES, BEEN "MY ROCK AND MY SALVATION". MSGR. ROBERT J. FOX, THE SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR, TOLD US THAT "PEACE IS A PERSON AND THAT PERSON IS JESUS CHRIST". NOT ONLY IS "CHRIST COUNTING ON ME" BUT "I ON HIM"....NO MATTER WHAT HAPPENS, HE IS PRESENT. I STRUGGLE TO LIVE THAT AND THANK CURSILLO FOR ALL ITS WISDOM AND INSIGHTS. I ALSO THANK ALL THE CURSILLISTAS I HAVE BEEN BLESSED TO KNOW WHO HAVE BEEN MY FELLOW PILGRIMS AND FOR, AS MY GRANDAUGHTER REMARKED, "ALWAYS BEING THERE..."

Revitalizing Our Ultreyas

Ultreya representatives were invited to come together to share ideas, positive experiences as well as their frustrations in a one day forum entitled "Revitalizing our Ultreyas" on November 8, 2015. The day began with a short welcome and appreciation to all of for answering God's call to shepherd other Cursillistas. We were reminded that as Shepherds, Ultreya reps gather their flock monthly, spiritually feed them, and they bring back those who have strayed away. Still, the most important thing that an Ultreya representative does is pray. They pray for guidance in leading their Ultreya, pray for the growth of their Ultreya, pray for help in gathering the lost of their Ultreya. It was so important to have all the Ultreya representatives together in one gathering. In addition to sharing ideas, there is the need to know they are not alone in leading their Ultreyas or in fulfilling their responsibility to our Cursillo Community.

The meditation was followed by two dynamic talks. The first talk, The Role of the Ultreya Representative was given by Jim Santos. Jim reminded us of the hierarchy of commitment and how family comes first. It is important to support our movement, our church and our Ultreyas. Still we need to make sure we are present to those closest to us—our families.

The second talk, entitled "Meaningful Ultreya: Spiritual Armor for the Journey", was given by John Meenagh . John started by pointing out that Eduardo Bonnín taught that Ultreya, along with Group Reunion, is a key component of the Cursillista's 4th day. It is what secures our friendship with Christ. Ultreya strengthens our friendships and helps us to persevere on the journey, which is focused on "being Christ" in our environments. Ultreya nurtures the three essential encounters: (1) friendship with myself; (2) with Christ; and (3) with my friends in Christ. John went on to talk about how small group sharing allows us to comfort and encourage one another. "Therefore, along with our blessings we must not be afraid to share our failures, our doubts or our fears because this sharing may help not only the person sharing but also the listeners."
