The number of applications was narrowed down to three possibilities. The candidates then met individually with the Executive Committee.

After much prayerful discernment it was formally announced on February 4, 2004, that the Executive Committee had selected Victor Lugo as the Executive Director of the National Cursillo Movement of the United States, effective February 1, 2004. Victor has been serving the National Cursillo Movement as the National English-speaking Coordinator.

We thank all who applied for the position. God surely has plans for their service to Him and His Movement in their current areas.

We also thank Jorge Barceló for his service during the past four months serving as Interim Executive Director.

Please continue to offer palanca for Victor, his wife Veronica and their family as they begin this new chapter in their lives, for the National Staff, and for the Cursillo Movement.

# Mother Teresa of Calcutta: Silence and Prayer

Mother Teresa (1910-1997), the founder of the Missionaries of Charity, was beatified on October 19, 2003. She described the spiritual experience that shaped her life in this way: "In 1946 I was going to Darjeering, to make my retreat. It was in that train, I heard the call to give up all and follow Jesus into the slums to serve Him among the poorest of the poor. I knew it was His will, and that I had to follow Him. There was no doubt that it was going to be His work." Here she describes the connection of prayer and silence that aided her ministry.

### PRAYER IS A DIALOGUE

Prayer is a two-way process: speaking and listening. God speaks to us: we listen. We speak to God: God listens. God speaks in the silence of our heart, and we listen. Then we speak to God from the fullness of our heart, and God listens. Our words are useless unless they come from the bottom of our heart.

### SILENCING OUR HEARTS

If we really want to pray, we must first learn to listen; for in the silence of the heart, God speaks. Silence of the heart, not only of the mouth, is necessary. Our prayer life suffers so much because our hearts aren't silent. The contemplatives and ascetics of all ages and religions have sought God in the silence and solitude of the desert, forest, and mountain.

We too are called to withdraw at certain intervals into deeper silence and aloneness, with God, together as a community as well as personally, to be alone with God, not with our books, thoughts, and memories but completely stripped of everything, to dwell lovingly in God's presence – silent, empty, expectant, and motionless.

#### LISTENING IN SILENCE

We need silence to be looking for God. There we accumulate the inward power which we distribute in action, put in the smallest duty and spend in the severest hardships that befall us.

Listen in silence, because if your heart is full of other things you cannot hear the voice of God. But when you have listened to the voice of God in the stillness of your heart, then your heart is filled with God. Then you can hear God everywhere: in the closing of a door, in the person who needs you, in the birds that sing, in the flowers, the animals – that silence which is wonder and praise.

### GIVE YOURSELF FULLY TO GOD

God will use you to accomplish great things on the condition that you believe much more in God's love than in your weakness. Just once, let the love of God take entire and absolute possession of your heart. Let your heart apply itself continually to increase this love of God by seeking to please God in all things.

These are only the first steps toward prayer, but if we never make the first step with determination, we will not reach the last one: the presence of God.

### MOTHER TERESA'S PRAYER

Come Holy Spirit, Guide me, protect me, Clear out my mind.

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# 14<sup>th</sup> National Encounter – Seattle, Washington

The 14<sup>th</sup> National Encounter will be held July 29 thru August 1, 2004, at Seattle University, Seattle, WA. The theme for the encounter is "UNITY WITH CHRIST" – "Let us profess the truth in love" (Ephesians 4:14-16).

Enclosed is the tentative agenda for the encounter. As we mentioned in our last mailing, the format for this encounter differs from last year's encounter. The format consists of several workshops on all aspects of the Cursillo Movement and are based on the following books, "Structure of Ideas" by Eduardo Bonnín, Bernardo Vadell and Francisco Forteza; and the revised 3-Day Manual. Participants will be able to select which workshops to attend. The above mentioned books will be available for purchase at the 2004 Encounter.

The cost for attending the encounter is \$250 per person. This covers the cost of meals, lodging, workshops, and activities, including the transportation to and from the Seattle Airport. Dinner and lodging is provided from Thursday evening until breakfast Sunday morning. The facilities will only accommodate 600 participants. Therefore, we strongly encourage you to submit your registration form as soon as possible.

Included with this mailing is a registration form so that you can be assured a place at the 14<sup>th</sup> National Encounter. Registration and the full payment of \$250 need to be completed by May 21, 2004. All registration forms and payments received after May 21, 2004 will be required to pay \$300 per person. Registration forms and payments received after June 18, 2004 will be required to pay \$325 per person. Cost for <u>registering</u> at the 14<sup>th</sup> National Encounter will be \$350 per person. It is imperative that we have a very good idea of the number of participants a couple of months in advance in order to coordinate an event of this magnitude.
