25th National Encounter Highlights

The 25th National Cursillo[®] Encounter was at Villanova University in Philadelphia, PA during July 23-26, 2015. It was an enlightening and exuberant gathering of Cursillistas in Love and friendship. The encounter participants totaled 653 Cursillistas from 5 language groups from all over the United States.

The National Encounter opened on Thursday evening with a special prayer and blessing by Fr. Alex Waraksa, National Cursillo Spiritual Advisor.



Most Rev. Carlos A. Sevilla, S.J., Bishop Emeritus of Yakima and National Cursillo Episcopal Advisor, celebrated the **Opening Mass** with 43 clergy consisting of priests and deacons and over 700 Cursillistas in attendance which included many volunteers from Region II. Bishop Sevilla thanked the laity and clergy for their support to Cursillo and the Church.



Dr. Ralph Martin, from the Diocese of Lansing, delivered the keynote address, **Friendship with Christ, Key to Evangelization.** Ralph shared: "the most important thing that happened to me, was to live a Cursillo in 1964, to encounter and to surrender my life to Christ . . . to love Christ and to help others to know Him."



Deacon Gary Terrana, Assistant National Spiritual Advisor, spoke on **Charity in the 21st Century**. Charity has such a high place of honor because it is the bond between God and man. It is superior to all the virtues. It is the first of all the virtues, because charity unites us intimately to God and our neighbor. To love God means that we want to please Him by doing good. To love our neighbors means that we want good things for them.



Maribel Gomez, from the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, spoke on **Attitudes and Reactions.** Systems and techniques can be taught but not the attitude. And we know that the reactions a person will have depend on their attitude. Attitude is the disposition that one develops from the experiences that one has. Our attitude is acquired from the experiences we have and the choices we make to adapt to our surroundings or environment.



Fr. John Meyers, from the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, spoke on **Prayer and Discernment**. The art of discernment, that is, distinguishing between desires and motives that are of God, and those which are not (the world, the self, and the devil), is the first area of concern for us. The second area of concern for us is discerning what God is doing in the world around us, or how to first recognize and then actively cooperate with God in each of our environments.



Walter Benavides, from the Diocese of Wichita, spoke on the **Means to Energize Our Fourth Day.** He has the certainty that joy comes from living a 4th Day in a constant state of joy in Christ. It is no coincidence that today is called the present, because that is precisely what it is, a gift, a present. And the leading cause of life's joy and this joy-like energy is contagious. and is the best way to energize the Group Reunions, our Ultreyas and our Schools of Leaders.



Hoang Tran, National Cursillo Service Administrator, spoke on the **National Cursillo Center and Direction**. Hoang provided an update on the benefits and opportunities of donating towards the \$3/YR Campaign. He introduced the \$5 Million Drive as a means for a brighter future for the National Cursillo Movement.

The National Encounter Fiesta was filled with joy, friendship, and an enthusiastic harmony which was demonstrated by the different cultural performances. Jesus was truly the Conductor of the Love Symphony #25 and we are blessed to be His instruments!
