

PALANCA

Recently questions about Palanca have come up and some Cursillistas have been encouraging letters of support from children and family members. Some candidates have been disappointed when letters that they were told were coming and that they were expecting didn't arrive as anticipated. The following is what the Cursillo Leaders






It is important to read some of the Palanca during the "Actual Grace" rollo to give witness of the 4th day community. Palanca should certainly be introduced during the Cursillo, without treating it as something like a "trump card," without dramatization. It should be made clear that it is normal among Christians, for a person to make sacrifices for others, even if they do not know them personally.



PALANCA

Palanca has always been an essential part of Cursillos (Precursillo, Cursillo & Postcursillo), and should be practiced in its entirety. Planca gives witness to the solidarity of the members of the Church. It is especially important during the Precursillo, the spiritual preparation for the Cursillo, therefore, both the Team and the outside community should include a Palanca campaign.





In closing, because we know the power of prayer and sacrifice on a Cursillo weekend, I encourage all to do Palanca for the upcoming weekends no matter if we make it known through a letter or not!

Palanca is the actual prayers, sacrifices and works of mercy. A note on a piece of paper or a greeting card does not constitute Palanca. A Palanca letter is one that is sent to the candidates and team, informing them of the prayers and sacrifices that one if offering to God on their behalf. A letter may be sent explaining what type of Palanca is being offered, but the letter is NOT the Palanca. The actual Palanca is the actionintercessory prayer, sacrifice or works of mercy-and it can be done without writing a letter.

Reflections on Study



Don't tell my lovely bride, Sue, this, but I enjoy waking up with two other women. The good news is that they are both nuns who I have grown very fond of over the last 15 years or since I began my Cursillo journey.



I wake up with them as a part of my morning prayer and time set aside for Study. As we learned on our Cursillo weekend, Study is the back leg of the tripod which supports our efforts on the front two legs, Piety (loving God) and Action (loving others). As we heard in the Study rollo, our sources for Study are books (don't just read good books, read the best) and Acts (study groups, gettogethers, Cursillo group reunions).



These two nuns are Sr. Melanie Swoboda and Sr. Joyce Rupp. They are both contributors to one source of my Study which is the Living Faith, a daily devotional which corresponds with the mass readings of the day. Sr. Melanie is a Sister of Notre Dame who has written books and led retreats and Sr. Joyce is a Servite Sister who also is an author and retreat leader. It never fails that their reflection for the day will be pertinent to where I am on my faith journey or for what I am experiencing in my family/life journey.



I know that the fourth week of Lent I will read in a Sr. Melanie Lenten devotional her thoughts on Psalm 34:19 "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted". She mentions that in all her travels she always meets new people. Despite their joy, friendliness, warmth and faithfulness she later finds out they have dealt with some kind of heartache and pain.

She was reminded of something she read – "Every person we meet is mourning something". Perhaps it's a loss of a loved one, sickness or disease, divorce, addictions, etc. She reminds her readers that "God will mend your heart-if you give him all the pieces" Her ending prayer: "God, remind me that everyone I meet today is mourning something-even the person I meet in the mirror".

Likewise, Sr. Joyce tends to always be on target. I still have handy a reflection by her that was from April 2015 based on the Acts 13:3 sentence "They laid hands on them and sent them off" (when the people of Antioch blessed Paul and Barnabas before their mission). She comments "One need not be ordained to give another a blessing. We each have the grace of the Holy Spirit to share with another. Parents sending children to school with a Sign of the Cross, spouses blessing each other before leaving for workthese are a few of the ways that the kindness of a blessing extends the Holy One's protective hope-filled and caring love". So I sav as Cursillistas, let's bless those we love.

I encourage you, my Cursillo bothers and sisters to be diligent in your Study. Find a routine that works for you. Find someone you too, will look forward to waking up to.

A true confession: I read the sports page before my morning prayer and Study time! Like I tell the fellas at Cracker Barrel at Grouping on Saturday mornings: You never know, God might ask me for a score!


